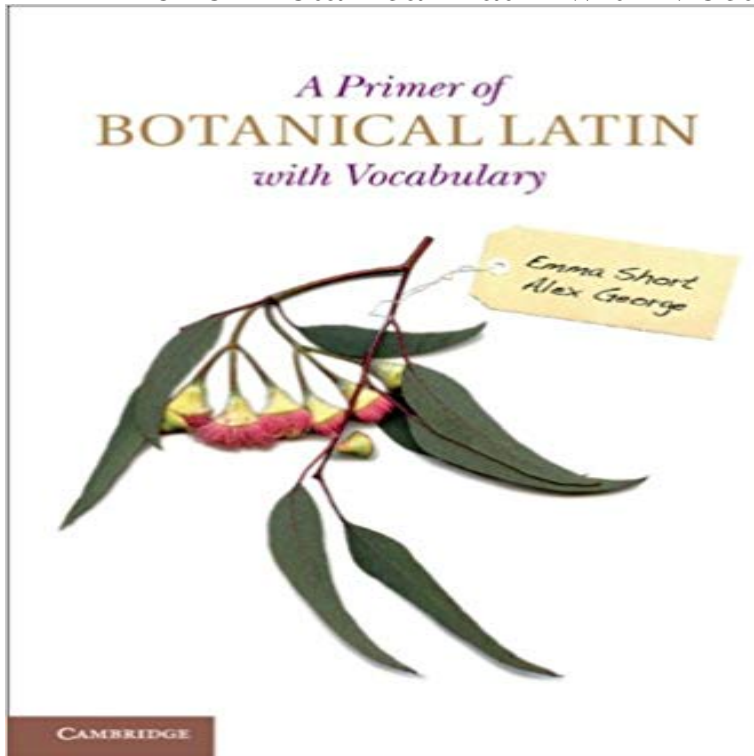


A Primer of Botanical Latin with Vocabulary
